Jeanne Stieber was named Norwalk Arts Center Volunteer of the Year for 2025 and Aubrey Darovich was named Teen Volunteer of the Year at an evening devoted to thanking all of NAC's volunteers for thousands of hours of hard work.

"Tonight we are here to celebrate and recognize our volunteers," said Lisa Bleile, chair of business affairs and volunteers for the NAC board. "The Board of Directors and I extend our appreciation for your support in
